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ABSTRACT

Mild head injury has been described as rare cause of idiopathic intracranial hypertension (IIH). In the presence of IIH, initial treatment is clinical and surgical treatment, such as lumboperitoneal shunt. Most cases have a good prognosis. The patient have 9-year-old male, went to the emergency room with a history of accidental fall, presenting headache, vomiting and blurred vision. Physical examination showed good overall condition. Neurological examination: normal. Fundoscopy: incipient bilateral papilledema.
